As the Social Apostolate celebrates its 50th anniversary, there's one member of the staff who has known this agency for 45 years, Fran McCombs. Fran is the manager of the thrift store. She is also a live history of the Social Apostolate and is a light to every person who walks into "The Boutique on Liberty" either as a paying customer or as a client, needing a helping hand and free clothing.

Fran discovered the thrift shop in 1973, by chance, where she found clothing for her children. Seeing that the manager needed help, she volunteered until Sr Catherine asked her to become an employee. Since 1993, she has greeted customers and Social Apostolate clients, treating them with love and kindness, joking and making them feel



special. She has a talent for helping people find precisely the clothing and items that they need. The joy of life and the kindness that shines from her eyes and smile lifts the spirits of all who enter. Fran hasn't had an easy life. She lost her mother, whom she credits with being her mentor and life guide, at age 15. She married at age 16, was divorced, and raised 6 children on welfare. One of her 6 children was killed in a car accident. But Fran is strong and tough as well as loving and compassionate.

The entire Social Apostolate is a beacon of God's love in our community. At the street front Fran does indeed "let light shine before the world."
